- Something unique about this building is it has a 19 and a half foot tall statue on top that weighs 15,000 pounds.



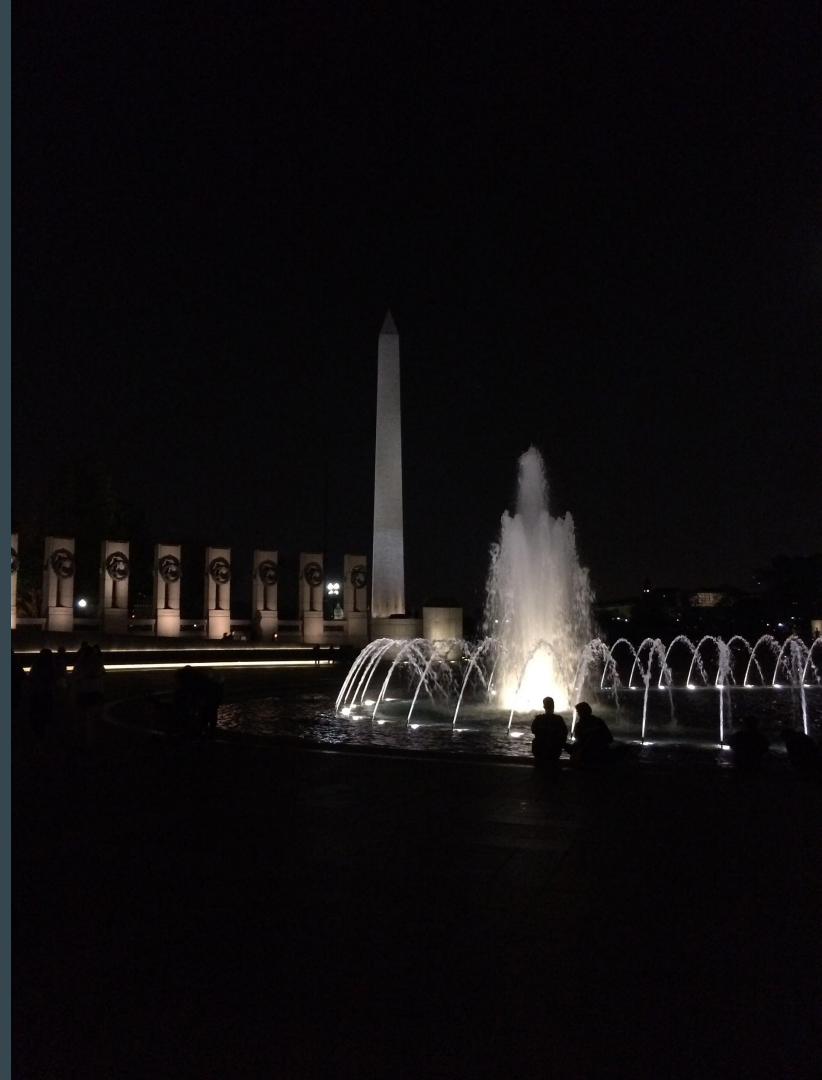
JFK's Grave

- This grave is unique because it has a flame that burns but will never go out.



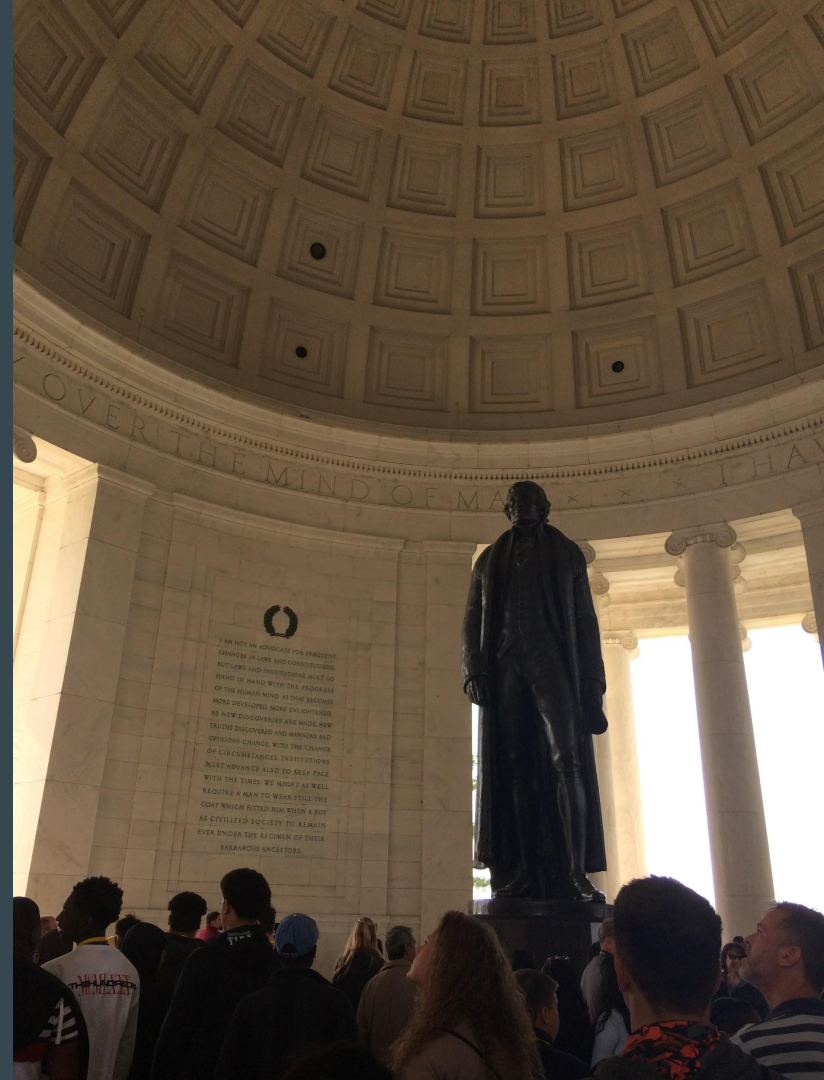
WWII Memorial
