\$458 Million in School Construction Projects Approved by Commission

The Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) today announced the approval of more than \$307 million in state funding for five school construction projects. Combined with \$151 million in local funding, these projects represent more than \$458 million in public construction work.

"OFCC's action today supports student success in local communities across the state," said Ohio Governor Mike DeWine. "The investments being made in these schools will create safe, modern, and flexible learning environments that promote opportunities for academic excellence and prepare students for a successful future."

State funding was approved for the following projects:

"The condition of school facilities impact student achievement, as well as teacher engagement and satisfaction," said OFCC Executive Director Cheryl J. Lyman. "These schools will be designed and constructed using best practices and last for generations."

Funding awards are contingent upon State Controlling Board approval.

Projects receiving funding offers from the Commission are:

Brunswick City School District (Medina) - To build one new high school for grades 9-12

Crestview Local School District (Columbiana) – To build a new PK-12 building

Fairport Harbor Exempted Village School District (Lake) – To build a new PK-12 building

West Carrollton City School District (Montgomery) – To build one new elementary school for grades 2-4 and one new middle/high school for grades 7-12 and Career Tech

Xenia School District (Greene) – To build one new middle school for grades 6-8; renovations and addition to Xenia High School for grades 9-12 and Career Tech
